CHICKERELL IS LOVELY ...BUT IT DOESN'T TAKE MUCH LOOKING TO FIND ISSUES



Wander around our friendly village and you will soon find problems that should have been sorted by Dorset Council. Gill **Taylor and Simon Clifford** have raised issues like the poor condition of East Street. Talking to residents were heard complaints about the road and the pavements in the area. **Gill** has taken this to Dorset Council – and success!

Expect to see resurfacing repairs in mid-May (expected 16th to 21st).

"It does mean the road will be closed between 9am and 4pm for a few days but the short-term inconvenience is worth it for the long term benefit," she said. "The Lib Dems are well known for being hardworking within our communities, we listen to problems families face and take action."

Gill's campaign was backed by **Simon:** "Gill has worked hard to bring this improvement to the area. There is a further improvement coming to the

junction of Chickerell Road and the link road and again she has ensure that work is carried out overnight to reduce the impact on people living nearby."

Gill and **Simon** have stepped up their campaign on buses – or lack of them – and also safety issues where they are sited. In particular people worry that poor car parking – such as the photo here – mean that shoppers using the Post Office and people queuing for the bus are placed at increased risk.

"I've raised this with Dorset Council and called for urgent action. I await a response..." said Gill.

We have taken the bus fight to First Bus and Dorset Council. First Bus told us they would not put back some routes to Weymouth due to difficulties with roads and parking. We were shocked. We took the comments to the Conservative Cabinet member for transport asking where is the community bus scheme he promised? No reply. We are still waiting.

The Lib Dems are committed to improving these bus routes and services. If elected, we will review the bus contracts and bus services, and prioritise areas that have seen reduced services, or buses cut completely.

WEYMOUTH CAR PARKING CHARGES


